Who's Running for Student Government?

Anyway, we're at SCVi, which is obviously a different thing!

Yes, that's right, Student Government elections are this Thursday!

What do you mean you don't know who to vote for?

Don't worry! We took the time to interview all of the candidates that were available!

“I would like to mainly just help out the president in more ways than the president would be able to [help himself], but also would like to make the school a safe place. If I make the school a safe place for one person, I feel I can help more,” states **Junior Ac Paredes**, whose goal is seemingly to become a mediator for students at SCVi, as well as someone to look out for their mental well-being.



Having been an advisory council member since last year, and an SCVi regular since 7th grade, he thinks it is important for everyone to be safe and feel included.

“I would gladly volunteer for everyone at this school”, he said, and also mentioned that he would like to be a person that people can go to talk to about anything with. A strong interview for a strong candidate.

“My first decision as vice president would be to help organize school events, and also talking to Harrison and the president about helping the treasurer get the vending machine fixed again, for everyone to enjoy.”

Says **Maddison Fanning**, another candidate for the surprisingly popular role of VP.



Speaking on the state of the school, she wants to be one to help make SCVi feel like a cleaner and safer place. She was also the first person to mention the school’s vandalism, stating that she believes “if [efforts to stop the vandalism] were coming from another student, and not a teacher, it would have a greater impact.”

Unfortunately, we were unable to contact the other potential Vice Presidents. But, believe it or not, VP isn't the only role available, and while many roles such as President and Secretary have only one candidate running, that is definitely not the case with the role of Treasurer!

"I'd like to fundraise in general for the people at this school,"; **Zoe Blinn**, who is our first candidate for Treasurer, would like to see the school have more, and better, materials as well as a higher budget for events and new programs (especially for those who want to do things other than theater).



She believes that the fundraisers done so far by the school lack any real sense of engagement, and would like to shy away from fundraisers "where you just send stuff to other people"

“I would specifically like to streamline production on our events, using spreadsheets to try to keep things organized. I noticed recently that running concessions, we can’t seem to keep a good inventory of our stuff. I would like to create a system that could help us do that better.” **Jordan Soto** is looking to take a very tidy and business-like approach to his possible role as Treasurer, wanting to target specific problems with organization in handling our school's resources and budget.



They want to help make sure the school is restocked before nearing deadlines, to try to make sure everything can be purchased within the budget, and to have every event planned and worked on ahead of time. A very strategic approach, and one that they hope will make the lives better of Treasurers yet to come.

All of these candidates, however different, had one thing unshakably in common: very strong introductions. Whichever candidates do win their titles, this will definitely be one of the most impactful elections on the school yet.

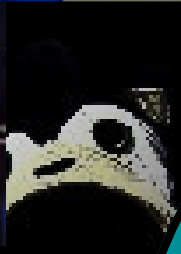
